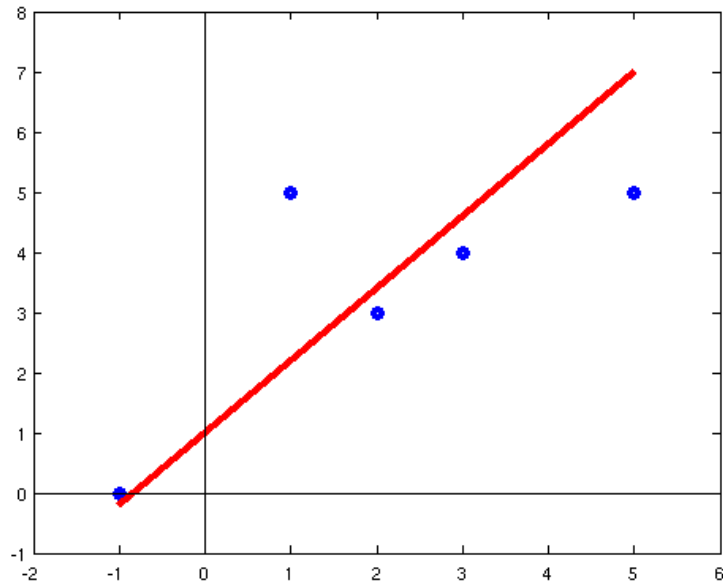

## QUIZ 2

Given the following data values

$$x = \{-1, 1, 2, 3, 5\} \text{ and } y = \{0, 5, 3, 4, 5\}$$



A graph of the five values is displayed above, together with the line (this is not necessarily the regression line)

$$\hat{y} = 1 + 1.2x$$

1. Compute the predicted values  $\hat{y}$  for the given  $x$  values using the line equation above.

You can use these formulas for your computations:

$$b_1 = \frac{n(\sum xy) - (\sum x)(\sum y)}{n(\sum x^2) - (\sum x)^2}$$

$$b_0 = \bar{y} - b_1\bar{x}$$

$$r = \frac{n(\sum xy) - (\sum x)(\sum y)}{\sqrt{n(\sum x^2) - (\sum x)^2} \sqrt{n(\sum y^2) - (\sum y)^2}}$$

4. What is the equation for the line of best fit (regression line) for the previous data values?
