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### Introduction

- Measuring relationship between presidential approval rating and the Dow Jones Index (2016-2018)
- Presidents
  - Barack Obama
  - Donald Trump
- Question 1: Is there a correlation between Americans' perceptions of a President's performance while in office and the growth or decline of the stock market?
- Question 2: If there is a correlation, which President would have more of a positive correlation?

### **Our Hypothesis**


- Trump's correlation would be more distinct than Obama's
  - More volatile president, reflected by the market
  - History of Republican presidents


### Collecting the Data

- Used R to wrangle and visualize the data
- Used Excel to analyze a linear regression

Obama's Presidential Approval Ratings by Month







